Dr. Vázquez-Connelly is a composer whose work canvasses solo, chamber, orchestra, wind band, chorus, and electronic media. Aside from compositional work, she is the Instrumental Music Instructor at Central Community College in Columbus, Nebraska.

Vázquez-Connelly is a member of the Lincoln Alumnae and Patroness chapter in Lincoln, Nebraska and has for the past four years organized "She Sings," a women composers concert. This concert features both local professionals and students, and is a benefit event for Lincoln Music Teachers Association's Music Outreach Project, which provides low-cost music instruction to eligible students.

my Riebs Mills is an initiate of the Beta Chapter at Northwestern University and a member of the SAI Composers Bureau. She was a Composer-Judge for the 2022 National Convention, where her composition "Flee!" premiered. The composition's preface states, "Flee!' is a novella, a short story." Its five movements are a journey from captivity to freedom, an exhilarating escape told through a driving string quartet. She has composed pieces for orchestra and band, winds and strings, voice, chorus, and piano. She holds a doctorate in Conducting from Catholic University, and both Bachelor's and Master's in Music from Northwestern University.

Mills is a renowned conductor, having guest conducted orchestras on four continents. She founded the National Women's Symphony in Washington, DC, serving as the first woman commander/conductor of the United States Air Force Band and Singing Sergeants. She was also Music Director of the La Crosse Symphony Orchestra for fourteen years, and served on the faculty of the Conductors' Institute at Bard College.

In honor of Women's History Month in March 2024, the United States Air Force Band highlighted their performance of "Flee!" on social media. The performance included retired CMSgt Deb Volker, former NVP Ritual and Fraternity Education, on violin. It can be found on their YouTube channel @TheUnitedStatesAirForceBand.

"Flee!" also inspired James Van Zandt, Director of Orchestras at Texas A&M University, to expand the original piece. He requested Mills create a version for string orchestra, to which she gladly agreed. The orchestra version premiered at Texas A&M in April 2024. Both the quartet and orchestra versions are available at CF Peters.



IN MEMORIAM **Diane Thome**



merican composer Dr. Diane Thome passed away on January 13, 2025. She was 82. Dr. Thome was the first woman to receive a Ph.D. in Composition from Princeton University, where she also received an MFA. She also held a Master of Arts in Theory and Composition from the University of Pennsylvania and two undergraduate degrees with distinction in piano and composition from the Eastman School of Music. She was recipient of a number of honors and awards, including Washington Composer of the Year (1994), Solomon Katz Distinguished Professor in the Humanities (1995–1996), and an International Computer Music Conference Commission (1998). She composed a wide array of solo, chamber, choral, and orchestral works, and was the first woman to write computer-synthesized music. Some of her works include Night Passage, an environmental theatre piece; Angels, a virtual reality artwork for computer; and Unseen Buds, for mixed choir and computer-realized sound.

Dr. Thome was a professor at the University of Washington and then chair of its Composition Program at the School of Music. She was composer-in-residence at a number of institutions, including the University of Sussex (England), Bennington College, and the University of Cincinnati. Dr. Thome was also a Composer-Judge for the SAI Inter-American Music Awards (IAMA) at the 1997 National Convention. Her commissioned work Bright Air/Brilliant Fire, for flute and tape, premiered at Convention's American Music Concert.

Her memoir, Palaces of Memory, is a personal recollection of a lifelong journey in music. It is available in both print and ebook.

That Star in the Picture album (Albany Records) was a double-award winner in the 2024 InterContinental Music Awards Pangea Classical Category, for my "Pie Jesu" (with Victoria Livengood, mezzo-soprano, and chamber orchestra) and "Beautiful Garden" (with Michael Buchanan, tenor, Denise Koncelik, flute, and composer at the piano). That Star in the

Picture landed on the 2023 Top 20 Classical (vocal) recording list of textura. Reflections album received a 5-star review from noted reviewer Henry Fogel: "exhibits wit, a melodic gift, a very natural feel for the keyboard and coloristic imagination" (Fanfare) and Luciano Feliciani, noted critic in Italy, in his review: "I would describe the new CD by the great American pianist and composer James Adler with one word: Stupendous" (Kathodik). David DeBoor Canfield interviewed me and also provided a glowing review in Fanfare.






