hen I was initiated by Eta Sigma at Eastern Kentucky University, SAI Philanthropies was always something I was aware of, but I didn't look into the different opportunities for myself. As I continued into alumnae life with the Lexington Alumnae chapter, Philanthropies was on my mind, but more as a donor.

As my time in SAI went on, I realized there were grant opportunities for alumnae members! I was early in my career, teaching general music, and wanted to expand my knowledge of Orff Schulwerk. I was approved for an SAI professional development grant and spent 2 weeks that summer submerged in the Orff culture working to become a better educator. As a Province Officer, I had a goal to make sure the chapters in my province knew about all the opportunities within SAI Philanthropies. I always said, "Apply! The worst that can happen is they say no." I'm proud to say that in my 7 years as PO, at least 1 member of the province received a "yes" each year. I received two more Professional development grants and then in 2018 was awarded a Music Education Outreach Grant to purchase steel drums (which I personally love to play) for my students. Providing more cultural diversity within my classroom, the steel drums have become an integral part of my program. The afterschool percussion ensemble shows off their steel drum skills on multiple concerts a year. If it weren't for SAI Philanthropies, I would still be working on getting together a class set.
