## **Convention Details:**

Date: July 17 through July 21, 2025

Location: Minneapolis, MN

**Convention Honoree:** Ruth Sieber Johnson, Executive Director Emerita! She will speak at the Welcome Luncheon on Friday.

### **Delegate Expectations:**

- Review election information with your chapter when it is made available.
- Chapter delegates (usually the incoming president) are expected to attend all general sessions, concerts, and workshops, sitting in their assigned seats.
- Dress in formal meeting attire.
- Vote for elected offices: Chapters must have a zero balance with National Headquarters to vote on fraternity business (newly installed chapters being the exception - they should contact the NVP Finance for their requirements).
- Attend the mandatory delegate orientation on Thursday, July 17 at 4:15 p.m. EST.
- POs and ROs will also attend a meeting prior to the delegate orientation at 3 p.m. EST.

# What goes on at Convention:

**Seating**: The NEB, and any speakers, will be on the front stage. Fraternity directors, Philanthropies Board and directors, and former NEB members sit in the front rows. The seating for each region starts with the Regional Officer followed by each Province Officer and chapter delegates in Greek alphabet order. Each Officer or chapter name will be clearly marked (please leave office/chapter name tags so they can be used again). Convention attendees who are not delegates will also have designated seating.

**Things to see and do**: Throughout the event, visit the SAI Philanthropies Inc. kiosk to make a donation or check on your convention grant. The SAI mall includes Herff Jones, our official jeweler, and Letter Market's SAI shop. There are also displays on a variety of topics from various fraternity directors.

#### Peek at the week:

**Thursday**: Registration opens for all attendees. In the evening, we'll open the convention with a collegiate initiation ceremony performed by the NEB and other national officers (formal musicale before and after). This will be followed by our opening reception.

**Friday**: The general business session of the Convention opens. Also happening is the Welcome Luncheon. There will also be a performance from the SAI Singers, a group of non-delegates who sing SAI songs from the songbook throughout the Convention. That evening will be the IAMA Premiere Concert and the winning composition.

**Saturday:** Phlea-Phlam will start the day Saturday and typically runs between 8 and 10 a.m. Many chapters will be selling SAI-related items, and LOTS of crafts, from shirts to tote bags to badge buddies, so bring your money. We recommend smaller bills, like ones and fives if paying cash. Some chapters will accept credit cards. Following Phlea-Phlam will be a general session, educational workshops, and later that evening the Philanthropies Benefit concert featuring violinist Rachel Barton Pine.

**Sunday:** NOC members and chapter delegates will be voting on new national, regional and province officers. Following the general session there will be afternoon free time. We'll wrap up the evening with our Dinner of Honors, which is like our "SAI gala" where you'll want to wear your nicest outfits. This will be followed by our Fraternity sing.

**Monday:** There will be additional workshops and the installation of newly elected officers, followed by closing ritual and adjournment of the convention.

**The Basics:** All voting delegates should plan to arrive at the hotel prior to 1 PM Central Time on Thursday, which is 11 a.m. Pacific Time. On Monday, the general session does not end until noon, so you should not plan to depart from the convention hotel prior to 3 PM Central. If you are elected to a Regional or Province office at Convention, you will attend a meeting on Monday morning. If you run for a NEB position and are elected, you will need to work with the NVP Finance to change your hotel/travel plans and expect to stay through noon on Tuesday, July 22.

#### Registration:

- Register online from the SAI Website.
- Early-bird registration is \$395. After May 31, this goes up to \$445.
- Registration package includes the welcome luncheon ticket, dinner of honors, workshops, Phlea-Phlam, concerts, and all convention activities.
- Support SAI Philanthropies, Inc. by upgrading your benefit concert ticket to a Patron Ticket for an additional \$150. This includes reserved seating at the concert and a private reception afterward with the performers.

# Travel:

- Airport: Minneapolis–Saint Paul International Airport, code MSP
- Train: Amtrak
- Airport transportation: Light rail (will take about 45 minutes and drops you two blocks from the hotel), shuttles, taxis, Uber, and Lyft

- Hotel parking: Valet (\$49/day) and self-parking (\$25/day or \$30/day for in-and-out privileges) always confirm price on the hotel website.
- Note: If planning to use a driver's license for air travel, you must have a Real ID by May 7, 2025. You can use a passport instead.

# Hotel and food information:

- Convention rate: \$189 plus tax per night per night. Room reservations are open via the SAI website and will remain open until July 1 or until sold out.
- Depending on people's comfort levels, they can have up to four people per room, which helps reduce costs.
  - --2 SAIs per room: \$94.50 per person, + tax per night
  - o --3 SAIs per room: \$71.33 per person + tax per night
  - --4 SAIs per room: \$59.75 per person + tax per night
- If you have any problems obtaining the SAI rate, please contact National Headquarters.
- We will not be coordinating roommates for this convention on a national level. Please contact your Province Officer for help in securing roommates.
- Food: Meals included are Welcome Lunch and Dinner of Honors, but the rest are on your own. Plan for one dinner with your province at the hotel or one of the restaurants nearby.
- To save on food costs, we recommend bringing your own breakfast items. In addition to the hotel restaurant, Prairie Kitchen and Bar there is the MPLS Market they told us they will have a bunch of grab-and-go items available for us, but know that the coffee line is going to build up during peak times, so we will also have to be patient.
- Within a 15-minute walk is a Target and restaurants, including Mother Clucker's Pizza,
  The News Room and Barrio which have big outdoor spaces Brit's Pub, Hell's Kitchen,
  Hen House Eatery, Eggy's Diner, Sonora Mexican Kitchen. It looks like many of these
  restaurants have curbside pickup or delivery options, but you would need to check with
  the restaurant itself for details.

## How the collegiate chapter convention fund works:

• If collegiate chapters made all convention fund payments in full over the past three years, they would have paid a total of \$750.

Example: Chapter has paid into their convention savings	
2022-23	\$250.00
2023-24	250.00
2024-25	
Total paid	750.00
Early bird registration	395.00
Remainder (chapter will receive this amount)	\$355.00

 Funds go into effect when: the delegate registers online for the National Convention and marks that they are the chapter delegate, they sign the delegate agreement form, and it is received at National Headquarters. At that time the remaining funds will be returned to the chapter.

- If registering before May 31, that returned amount will be \$355. If registering after May 31, it will be \$305. Don't lose that \$50! It can be used for other convention-related expenses.
- As a reminder, any collegiate chapters reactivated or installed during the past three
  years will vary depending on the amount paid into the convention fund. These particular
  chapters will receive information about their funds from the NVP Finance let her know if
  you have not.

## **Expenses covered:**

As the chapter delegate, you are your chapter's representative at the National Convention. Thus, all collegiate and alumnae chapters should be assisting their delegate with the costs of attending convention. This includes, but is not limited to:

- Travel
- Meals
- Hotel
- Delegate registration (for alumnae chapter delegates)
- Other convention attendance-related expenses

# Costs and travel tips:

One of the first things we recommend is for collegiate chapters to see if they can apply for some student government, student organization, or music department funds to help attend convention. Many schools will provide several hundred dollars for attending an educational conference like convention.

- If you need help making flight and hotel reservations, contact your faculty advisor or Province Officer. Your PO will be able to help you find a roommate or roommates among the delegates and attendees from your province.
- When booking flights, there are several things that will help you do this: 1) know what
  airlines fly out of your city. 2) check specific airline sites or an aggregator site like Kayak,
  that will show you flights on different airlines in one place. Be careful of the fine print make sure you know of payment and cancellation policies.
- Flights are actually good right now! As of April 28, average basic economy airfares into Minneapolis are \$200 from Denver, \$250 from Los Angeles, \$300 from Philadelphia, and \$230 from Orlando.
- When booking the hotel, click on the link on the Convention page. You will be able to change the room and guest numbers. You should know the number of people you plan to have in your room before you make a reservation. And only one person among the roommate group should make the reservation. You can add the names of the other people during that time.

## Helpful hints for packing:

PDF checklist: What to Pack for Convention

Clothing suggestions:

- Two travel outfits
- Five formal business meeting attire with appropriate shoes, meaning no flip flops
- Two casual outfits and/or SAI gear
- Two fancier outfits for the Philanthropies concert and Dinner of Honors.
- Light sweater or jacket for cold meeting rooms

#### Other items:

- SAI badge and other valuables if traveling by airplane or another method where you will be separated by your luggage, pack it in your CARRY-ON luggage. That goes for any additional valuables you are bringing.
- SAI songbook
- Snacks and breakfast items for your room
- Money for Phlea-Phlam, food, and cash tips for baggage handlers, bellhops, and the room housekeepers
- Other important items: phone, chargers, hotel, airline, and emergency contact information, first aid items and necessary toiletry items, and medication (which should be packed in your carry-on luggage as well).
- Instrument and music if performing in a musicale.

**Note**: When packing, please remember weight restrictions and extra fees on baggage for airline travel.

#### **Elections:**

All Province Officers, Regional Officers and NEB members are elected or re-elected at our National Convention. The electronic voting process will be conducted via paper ballot. The Elections Committee Chair and Executive Director Christine Bruns will host a webinar on June 29 to discuss this process. As a reminder, elections are first thing Sunday morning, with runoffs being immediately after the general session Sunday, if needed. Each voting delegate will vote for Province Officer in their respective province, Regional Officer in their respective province, and each elected national officer.

# Responsibility of Delegates and Election information:

- Thursday stop by the credentials desk to verify your voting information. YOU MUST DO THIS.
- Friday the officer slate will be read and nominations from the floor will be taken.
- If you are planning to nominate yourself or someone else, we encourage you to review the job descriptions for each office and attributes needed for the position.
- When the Slate of Officers is announced, make sure you review it and discuss it with your chapter.
- For those on the slate and those nominated from the floor, you will have an opportunity to review the biographies and what each candidate has written during the convention.
- There is an opportunity to meet and speak with RO, PO, and NEB candidates prior to the election.
